Under Pressure - 10

This stage of a pressure injury has partial-thickness loss of skin with exposed dermis. Adipose and deeper tissue are not visible.

Unstageable Pressure Injury



Under Pressure - 30

This stage of a pressure injury has full thickness skin and tissue loss with exposed or directly palpable fascia, muscle, tendon, ligament, cartilage, or bone. Undermining and/or tunneling often occur.

Under Pressure - 30

Stage 4 Pressure Injury



Under Pressure - 40

Intact or non-intact skin with persistent non-blanchable deep-red, maroon, or purple discoloration. This injury typically results from intense or prolonged pressure and shear forces at the bone-muscle interface.

Under Pressure - 40

Deep Tissue Pressure Injury



Under Pressure - 50

The presence of this in a wound prolongs the inflammatory phase and facilitates bacterial proliferation, resulting in an increased risk of infection.

Everybody Hurts - 30

An iatrogenic syndrome of abnormal behavior that develops secondary to inadequate pain management. Behaviors include escalation in analgesic demands, clock-watching, or doctor shopping. The behavior ceases with adequate pain relief.

This pain medication is primarily metabolized in the liver and is excreted in the urine. Because of its low plasma protein binding and low probability of interfering with the metabolism of other drugs, it is recommended for patients taking multiple medications.
